Plans for a new **Neighbourhood Centre in** Tinsley.

n June 2006, a Masterplan for Darnall, Attercliffe and Tinsley was agreed by Sheffield City Council. . This Masterplan approved a regeneration framework across the area, and included a project focused on improving Highgate Centre to create a heart for the area.

The East Sheffield Regeneration Team asked URBED, a consultancy firm specialising in urban regeneration, to conduct a study to find out how the regeneration of Highgate Centre could be achieved, along with a realistic plan for delivering the project.

With the help of URBED, Savills, and Tinslev Forum the team set out to discover what a new Neighbourhood Centre for Tinsley could include. A workshop was held in Tinsley in November 2008 inviting comments and discussion from residents and businesses alike. The valuable feedback received was used to develop 4 options showing how the existing Centre could be improved.

In January 2009, the Team visited a number of different locations within Tinsley in a large red bus to ask local people their views on the 4 options. In addition, residents were asked to complete questionnaires which were analysed in depth. These gave positive feedback for both Options 3 and 4 but overall, Option 3 was preferred because the shops and parking were clearly visible from Bawtry Road. In May 2009, local residents and businesses were invited to

an event at which Option 3 was presented we are working towards demolishing this as the preferred way of improving Highgate Centre. The plans were well received.

URBED have prepared a detailed report showing the 4 options and realistic ways for us to deliver regeneration for Highgate Centre. The completed report will be available on Sheffield City Council's website in the summer.

Option 3. This is the preferred option for Highgate Centre and shows how it could look in the future. The scheme includes a Medical Centre and library (blue building), shop units and a small supermarket fronting the road and a number of houses on the left hand

As a result of the project, the Council has already purchased the Car Sales Lot and

as soon as possible. The cleared site will be landscaped making the area look more attractive. This will open up the existing Highgate Centre to passing trade from Bawtry Road.

The East Sheffield Regeneration Team will continue to work with businesses at the Centre and residents of Tinsley in order to progress the regeneration of the scheme, but this is a long term project and it will take a number of years to deliver and complete.

- It offers affordable loans to people who have been saving with them for 12 weeks or more, as an alternative to doorstep lenders and high cost loans
- It has more than 60 collection points around the City, and 4,500 adult members and 2,500 junior members
- It is authorised and regulated by the Financial Services Authority
- It has an independent Money Advice Worker available every weekday at FISY to offer help with money matters (budgeting, benefits entitlement, money problems etc)

- FISY also offers money management courses to community groups
- Courses are easy to book and free
- The Financial Capability Worker will put you a programme together to fit the time you have available and the interests of your group and bring all materials needed with them
